These roles may involve do shift-work, with long hours. Salaries vary, but workers must keep up with physical demands. If employees can't meet expectations, they risk being made redundant, though some resign to pursue less demanding jobs.
- B. Some industries, like manufacturing, see employees face redundancy. Workers apply for a job, hoping for stability, but automation can take over tasks. Those doing manual work or shift-work are

often affected. Salaries may be decent, but job security isn't guaranteed. Employees must keep up with technology to stay employed, or they might resign to avoid being made redundant unexpectedly C. Careers like nursing or security often require employees to do shift-work. To apply for a job, candidates fill in detailed applications. Salaries are often higher due to irregular hours, but workers must keep up with demanding schedules. Some resign because of burnout, while others risk being made redundant if they can't adapt. Manual work may also be part of these roles.
